



Thinking Day message from our County President


Dear Everyone,

Grassroots Grants

The Government has made available £130 million in England as small grant funding for voluntary groups. This can be a minimum grant of £250 and a maximum grant of £5,000, which can be awarded as one or more separate grants over one or more years during the three year life of the programme.

Most guiding units are eligible to apply for this if they have been in existence for at least a year, have an annual income of less than £20,000 and can provide their last set of annual accounts and have a unit account with at least two unrelated signatories.

Greater London West has already been successful with Division and District applications for building works and a Guide company and Rainbow unit who have secured grants towards their rents.

Please ensure that applications are ready in good time for closing dates and let me know when you have an application to submit so that we do not flood the system. The next deadline is 27th February.

Examples of what can be funded are:

- The purchase of equipment such as a computer, oven or furniture
- The costs of putting on a local event or workshop
- Contribution to the cost of rent
- Cost of attending a conference or event
- Training for volunteers
- Staff costs to employ someone such as a supervisor or a co-ordinator
- Expanding an existing project
- Activities that support local community activity
- Activities that meet needs in the local community
- Funding to support a group to achieve a quality or other standard relevant to their activities.

Thames Community Foundation run the scheme for the boroughs of Kingston, Merton, Richmond and Sutton and information is available on their website www.thamescommunityfoundation.org.uk, or you can contact me for more details.

It would be good to see more nominations coming from the girls themselves and we would like Leaders to encourage their units to consider who they think is worthy of nomination. We would love to see lots of nominations each month, especially from the Divisions who have so far made very few nominations. Some ideas for spending the award scheme money from JPF:

- *Buying equipment for a specific activity, e.g. sport/game, microwave*
- *Hiring in a specialist worker, e.g. theatre artist, fitness coach,*
- *Arranging a special trip for the group, e.g. meal, bowling, cinema*
- *Holding your own celebration event or making your regular end of term party go with more of a swing!*
- *Holding an event for a local community group which is run by your young people, e.g. a concert at a hospice, a play for a retirement home, a fundraising event for a registered charity etc.*

You must not spend the money on:

- *Everyday costs, e.g. hall hire, electricity, renovations etc.*
- *Something which does not benefit 11-25 year olds*
- *Something which benefits 1 or only a few individuals*

Remember:

- *No more than two awards in any six month period can be spent on the same item. You cannot 'bank' awards for future use.*
- *The winner should decide how the award money is to be spent immediately after being chosen for the award. The money should be spent as soon as possible after this.*
- *You must keep receipts just in case we ask you to supply them to us.*

This event will be a celebration of those who have received awards in 2008 and there will be a presentation of medallions, together with a presentation of the cheques to those Leaders who gained awards in December. Attendance at this event is expected, as part of the scheme, and therefore we expect to see most of the award winners there. The evening will include entertainment and we are hoping that some of our "Guiding Stars" will come and entertain us.

All the girls and Leaders who received awards in 2008 will be invited and may bring up to two guests. Leaders, Commissioners and supporters will also be invited. We will very shortly be sending out initial letters of invitation to the girls, with copies to Leaders and Commissioners, asking for confirmation that they will be attending and these names will be forwarded to the Jack Petchey Foundation who will provide personal invitations for those who confirm attendance. We will need to receive replies to this letter within two weeks. Jack Petchey will be arranging publicity and we are therefore requesting that all Achievers wear official GGUK uniform with blue or black trousers or skirts.

APPLICATIONS CLOSE ON 1st FEBRUARY.

We recommend applying as soon as possible as the most popular sessions are filling up fast (attached is the most recent application form) The main entrance to the school is to the left of A298/Bushey Road close to the A3 junction and before the New Malden Tesco.

There is parking on the school ground and although they are extending the car park for us it will still be limited so please car share or if you are able to use public transport.

The 265, 152, 131 and 163 buses stop near the school and both Raynes Park and Motspur Park stations are walking distance from the school. From Raynes Park Station come out the Coombe Lane entrance. Turn left at the traffic lights turn left walk up West Barnes Lane passed West Wimbledon Primary the school is on the right after you have crossed under A3. From Motspur Park Station come out of the station the Claremont Ave side (side without ticket office). Turn right into Claremont Ave, walk all the way to the bottom of this road turn right into Burlington Road which becomes West Barnes Lane, use the footbridge next to the level crossing to cross West Barnes Lane and you are next to the school!

GO! Trainings

We have now held several training sessions to help prepare Leaders for entering data for their units and we had hoped by now we would almost all have completed this exercise.

However, as you will have heard there have been some technical problems with the system which has meant our GO! LIVE date has been postponed. We had planned to run some more sessions at Ewell but have decided to defer these until we have firmer information. However, as you will see from the following extract from the Streamline newsletter below this may be a while yet.

"Throughout this project we have been committed to delivering a system of the best quality that will be right for our members. A couple of significant areas need more work before we meet the high standards we have set ourselves, so on 5th January, key volunteers and staff agreed that we would not go live until we were confident that we had a system that met those standards. We contacted the Counties scheduled to go live in the first 12 weeks and, despite their initial disappointment, the decision was welcomed with the most positive attitude and loyal support. We truly appreciate it. The project volunteers and staff continue to work closely with our commercial partners to make sure that the investigations and necessary developments are made as swiftly and as efficiently as possible. At the time of writing, we do not have a full enough picture of the amount of work required to estimate the impact of the delay. ... For Counties with the earlier go-live dates, you will have more time to explore the updated training site and get even more familiar with Go! before you take responsibility for your own records." While you're eagerly waiting for Go! you may be interested to know that Go! will have its own separate log-on on Girlguiding UK's new website, until all of the counties and BGIFC have gone live."

Centennial International Opportunities 2009-2010

1) Region trip to South Africa 2010
